In the depths of despair, Josh found hope, love and community at Wayside Chapel.

At 18, tragedy upended Josh’s life.

Overwhelmed by his father’s sudden death, he found solace in the tunnels of St. James train station in Sydney, near his dad’s workplace. Every day, he scanned the countless faces walking by, hoping that it was all a mistake, and he would see his father once again. Drugs became his refuge, escalating his shame and keeping him on the streets.

But over time, Josh grew the courage to turn to Wayside for love and support. We offered him hot showers, clean clothes, and eventually helped him find secure housing and full-time work. He started to form connections with the Wayside community. One step at a time, Josh worked hard to transform his life.

“Wayside was like a home, when you couldn’t go home,” says Josh. “I felt worthless, but then realised people do care.”

With the support of Wayside, Josh has worked hard to transform his life. He is now clean from drugs, has a full-time job and has a home with his loving family. He couldn’t be happier with how far he has come and excited to be on a path to a better future.

With a heart to help always on display, Josh is a proud member of the Wayside community. From delivering blankets to rough sleepers and helping out at community centres around Kings Cross, Josh has found a purpose and connection that he’d been seeking for many years.

Graham’s story

Wayside Grandfather Graham Long has left a gift in his Will for future generations (Former Pastor & CEO, 2004-2018)

It’s a rare thing to know you are the right person in the right place at the right time and when I began at Wayside in 2004, I knew this – and yet I knew it in a way that the mission was bigger, greater and more central, than me.

During these years I was fully alive, loving the work, the people we served and the people who came alongside to help. In 2004, our buildings were dilapidated and in a large part, condemned. While I couldn’t see our future path, I had a strong sense of our destiny. I didn’t know much about fundraising, governance or management but I knew our city, state and country needed Wayside; and skilled people, good people, agreed that it must not be allowed to drift into history.

Everything we know about ourselves has come as a gift from someone else. Others provided for us, others sacrificed for us, others saw potential in us, others believed in us. Our very bodies we discovered as a gift from others. Others taught us, others modelled discipline, passion and the value of hard work. Our achievements are like the baton in a relay race.

I’ve tried in my life to invest in others and as I approach the end of my life, I ponder how I might use my estate as an investment for others. I’d like to use my last gift to prove there is life after death. When I’m gone, I’d love to think I was helping to provide an opportunity for someone who never had my advantages.

Making a lasting impact is easy

Here's how

1 Speak with your loved ones

Talk to those closest to you about your decision to leave a gift in your Will to charity. Doing so means you trust the organisation and believe in the vital work they do. Wayside Chapel would be honoured to be held in such high regard.

2 Choose your legacy

There are many ways you can leave a gift to Wayside Chapel in your Will, which include:

- **Residual bequest:**
Pass on the remainder of your estate after other legacies have been fulfilled.
- **Specific bequest:**
Specify the percentage share or dollar amount you'd like Wayside Chapel to receive.

Many of our supporters have chosen to leave a percentage or residual rather than a fixed dollar

amount as the gift retains its value over time, keeping up with inflation and eliminating the need for you to update your Will later on.

3 Use the correct wording

Please see below the Gift in Will wording with all gift options. You can delete the invalid gift types.

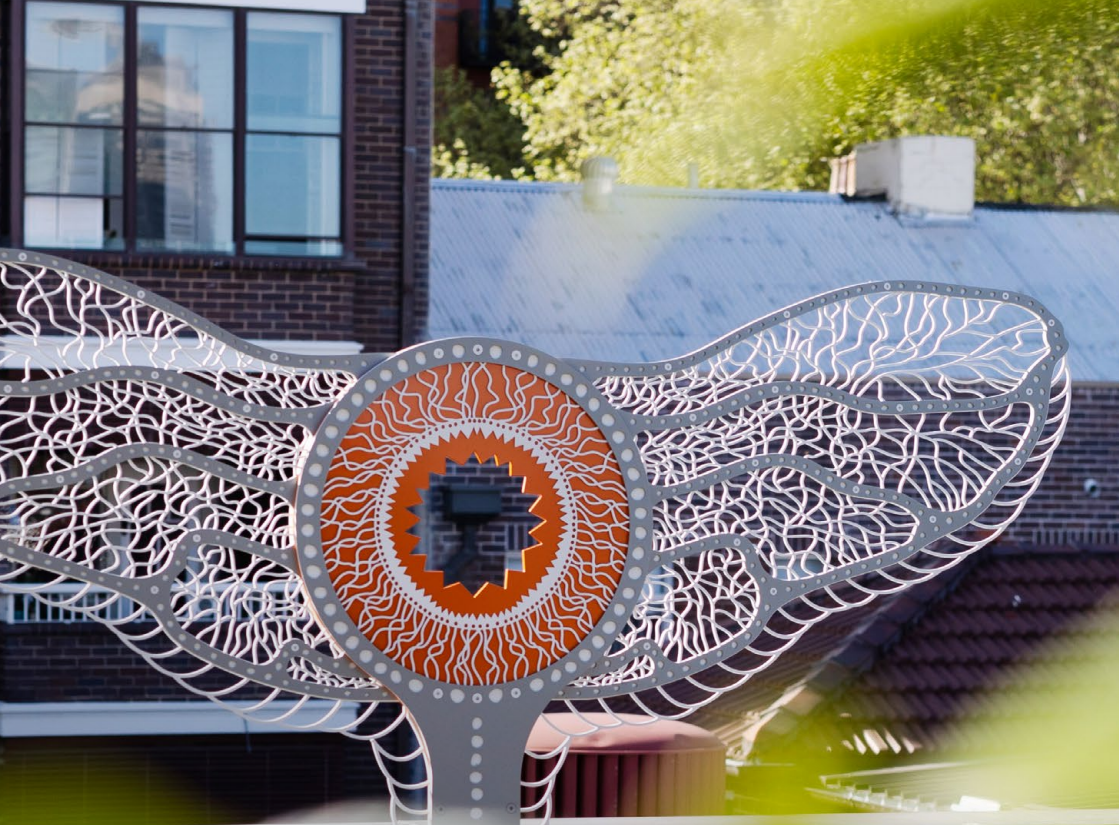
4 Write and legalise your Will

If you already have a Will in place, you will need to prepare a simple codicil to update your wishes. If you do not have a Will, you will need to include a bequest when your Will is prepared. A solicitor,

lawyer or estate planner can assist you to do this under your direction. Your Will is not legal until it is signed and witnessed by two people. You can change your Will and your beneficiaries at any time.

5 Please let us know

Your Will is a deeply personal matter, but if you let us know about your gift to Wayside Chapel, we can express our gratitude and keep you updated on our community work. No need to disclose the amount—just a heads-up is enough. Frequently Asked Questions

Why leave a gift in my Will to Wayside Chapel?

We rely on the kindness of people like you to help us continue our work, as government funding only covers 12% of our costs.

How do I make or change my Will?

We would strongly advise the use of a solicitor to obtain expert advice and ensure accuracy. We also advise that you consult a solicitor when writing or making changes to an existing Will.

Can I make a gift in my Will to more than one charity?

Yes, your solicitor can arrange this for you.

Do I need to leave my entire estate to Wayside Chapel?

No, a gift of any size will make a significant impact on the programs and services we provide for our community.

What type of gift would Wayside Chapel prefer?

Whilst any gift is greatly appreciated, a residual legacy or a percentage are the preferred options because they automatically keep up with inflation, eliminating the need for you to update your Will later on.

Why should I let you know that I have left you a gift in my Will?

We would love the opportunity to thank you personally for your future support, and keep you updated on the great work happening at Wayside. You can let us know about your decision by calling or emailing us. Alternatively, you may like to ask your solicitor to notify us on your behalf. Confidentiality of your advice will be respected at all times.

What if I want my gift to remain anonymous?

We would still love to thank you privately, however, we respect all our supporters' wishes and your details will be held in strictest confidence. You will control the level of contact that you receive from us.

I have already made my Will - is it too late for me to leave a gift in my Will to Wayside Chapel?

Not at all. Changing your Will and adding a gift to Wayside Chapel is easy - all you have to do is make a 'codicil' (or a document that amends a previously executed Will). When you next see your solicitor, just take a copy of our wording with you and they can simply update your existing Will for you.

Our promise to you

- We acknowledge the significance of your wish to leave a gift to Wayside Chapel.
- We understand that loved ones come first, and we encourage you to discuss your intention with them before finalising your Will.
- We will always respect your privacy. Any information you give us regarding your Will shall be held in strict confidence and shall not be publicly disclosed without your express permission.
- We'd love to hear whether you've included Wayside Chapel in your Will, but you don't have to tell us if you don't want to.
- If you do decide to tell us that you intend to leave a gift, we'll keep you updated on our work, in the ways that you prefer.
- We will ensure your gift is used in the most effective way.
